Heard learned counsel for the parties.

By this order, CRM-M-26237-2020 and CRM-M-26255-2020, shall stand disposed of.

Gurmeet Singh @ Budhu and Manmeet Singh @ Lambar @ Sahil, pray for bail pending trial in a criminal case arising from FIR No.118, dated 19.07.2018, registered under Sections 307, 452, 148 and 149 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860, in which offences under Sections 302 and 120-B of IPC, were added later on, at Police Station Division No.2, Ludhiana.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has drawn the attention of the Court to the order passed by a Coordinate Bench, on 19.08.2020, granting the concession of bail to Jatinder Pal Singh @ Sunny and Vishal, by a detailed judgment.

Mr. S.P.S. Aulakh, Advocate, who appears for the first informant, has admitted that the role attribution to the petitioners herein is on a lower pedestal than the accused who have been granted the bail i.e. Jatinder Pal Singh @ Sunny and Vishal vide order dated 19.08.2020.

It is undisputed that SLP ( Criminal) filed challenging order dated 19.08.2020 has been dismissed.

For the reasons recorded in the order dated 19.08.2020, the petitioners are also directed to be released on bail, upon their furnishing personal bonds for a sum of Rs.2 lakh each, along with two sureties for a

like sum each, to the satisfaction of the Illaqa/Duty Magistrate concerned.

The petitioners shall also deposit their original passports with the Illaqa/Duty Magistrate and undertake, by way of their bonds, that they will not leave the State of Punjab without the permission of the Court. Further, the petitioners shall desist from causing any inducement, threat or promise to any person connected with the case and shall maintain peace and good conduct.

Accordingly, both the petitions are allowed.

All the pending miscellaneous applications, if any, are disposed of, in view of the above-stated order.
