The petitioners are the accused in FIR No.108 dated 11.12.2016 on the file of Police Station Kiratpur Sahib, District Rupnagar, registered under Sections 323, 324, 506 and 34 IPC. By way of this petition filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C, they seek quashing of the said FIR.

According to the petitioners, the matter was amicably settled with the complainant, respondent No. 2 herein, and a compromise deed was executed to that effect on 10.07.2020. It is on the strength of this compromise that they seek relief presently.

Mr. Harpreet Singh, learned counsel, entered appearance for the

complainant, respondent No.2, and confirms the factum of the settlement and the execution of the compromise deed dated 10.07.2020. He states that his clients have no objection to the subject FIR being quashed..

Mr. Saurav Kharana, learned Deputy Advocate General, Punjab, would state that no other cases are registered against the petitioners and they have no known criminal antecedents.

Given the aforestated circumstances, as the fate of the case stands sealed by the settlement arrived at by and between the parties, there is no purpose served in the State wasting its resources in carrying it forward to its inevitable and futile conclusion.

The petition is allowed. FIR No.108 dated 11.12.2016 on the file of Police Station Kiratpur Sahib, District Rupnagar and all proceedings relating thereto are accordingly quashed.
