Hearing of the case was held through video conferencing on account of restricted functioning of the Courts.

The petitioner prays for interim bail pending trial for a period of six weeks in a criminal case arising from FIR No.30, dated 15.01.2019, registered under Section 21/61/85 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985, at Police Station City Sirsa, District Sirsa.

The bail application of the petitioner i.e. CRM-M-3402-2020 was dismissed by this Court on 21.05.2020 with the following order:-

“This is second petition filed by the petitioner for grant of bail pending trial in a criminal case arising from FIR No.30 dated 15.1.2019 registered under Section 21 of the NDPS Act at Police Station City Sirsa, District Sirsa.

Love Kumar was apprehended with 21 grams Heroin. During investigation on his disclosure, the petitioner was nominated as an accused. First bail petition of the petitioner was dismissed as withdrawn on 25.9.2019. The petitioner is involved in eight more cases under the NDPS Act.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner has a four years old son who is at present

residing with his grandparents as wife of the petitioner had left him. He further submits that the petitioner himself was a drug addict but he was never involved in the trade of contraband.

On the other hand, learned counsel for the State contends that in FIR No. 264 dated 20.4.2017 registered under Section 21A, 27A, 61, 85 NDPS Act at Police Station City Fatehabad, FIR no. 624 dated 17.10.2016 registered under Sections 21B, 61, 85 NDPS Act at Police Station City Fatehabad and FIR No. 86 dated 30.11.2017 registered under Sections 21A, 61, 85 NDPS Act at Police Station City Sirsa, heroin was recovered from the conscious possession of the petitioner.

Keeping in view the aforesaid facts, this Court is not inclined to grant concession of bail to the petitioner.

Hence, the present petition is hereby dismissed.”

The petitioner claims that he suffers from Psychiatric disorder (Opiod addiction) and pain in his knee joint.

This court has considered those facts.

Keeping in view the fact that the petitioner is involved in as many as 9 cases including the present one under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985, no ground for grant of interim bail is made out.

Dismissed.
