The petitioner prays for grant of anticipatory bail in FIR No. 92 dated 20.06.2020, registered under Sections 323, 324, 148, 149 of the IPC (Section 326 IPC added later on) at Police Station Dera Baba Nanak, District Gurdaspur.

The operative part of the order dated 08.09.2020, vide which the petitioner has been granted interim bail, is reproduced below:

“Contents that alleged fight had taken place between the complainant and co-accused Kuldeep Singh @ Keepa as well as Dilbagh Singh @ Bagga, but petitioner has no role at all.

Further contends that CRM-M-18359 of 2020, whereby the interim protection was granted to co-accused Guriqbal Singh @ Gopi is pending for 07.12.2020.

Notice of motion for 07.12.2020.”

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner, in pursuance to the order dated 08.09.2020, has already appeared before the SHO/Investigating Officer and has joined the investigation.

Learned counsel for the State, on telephonic instructions from the Investigating Officer, has not disputed the factual position and submits that the petitioner has joined the investigation and is no more required for any further investigation.

However, learned counsel for the complainant submits that injury Nos. 8 and 9 are attributed to petitioner and co-accused Balwinder Singh @ Bhila, which are declared grievous and victim/complainant Jang Bahadur Singh has suffered huge medical expenses.

On this, learned counsel for the petitioner has volunteered that without any prejudice to the right of defence of the petitioner, he will hand over a demand draft of Rs. 25,000/-, favouring the complainant.

In view of the above, the petition is allowed and the interim bail granted to the petitioner, vide order dated 08.09.2020, is made absolute subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

However, this will be subject to a condition that petitioner will hand over a demand draft of Rs. 25,000/- favouring complainant/victim Jang Bahadur Singh, to the Illaqua Magistrate within a period of 30 days from today, which in turn will be handed over to said complainant/victim, without any prejudice to the right of defence of the petitioner.
