[1]. The case has been taken up for hearing through video conferencing.

[2]. Petitioner seeks grant of regular bail in his 3rd attempt under Section 439 Cr.P.C in case bearing FIR No.366 dated 04.12.2014, registered under Sections 307, 506, 148 and 149 IPC (302 IPC added later on) at Police Station Focal Point District Ludhiana City.

[3]. Vide order dated 10.07.2019 passed by the Co-ordinate Bench of this Court in CRM-M No.27850 of 2019 and order dated 06.02.2020 passed in CRM-M No.43307 of 2019, passed

by this Court, direction was issued to the trial Court to ensure that trial is concluded expeditiously. In case, if the trial is unnecessary delayed, the petitioner would be having a right of consideration of his regular bail in accordance with law.

[4]. Thereafter, vide order dated 23.06.2020 passed by the Co-ordinate Bench of Court in CRM-M No.14236 of 2020, direction was issued to the trial Court to conclude the trial and pronounce the judgment before 31.12.2020.

[5]. Thereafter in CRM-M No.26747 of 2020 titled 'Vikas and State of Punjab', this Court passed the following operative part of order on 14.09.2020:-

“Evidently, the trial was delayed on account of the order passed in the application under Section 311 Cr.P.C. for summoning of Record Keeper of Rajindra Medical College which was allowed on 29.10.2019. The said order has attained finality.

Out of 23 prosecution witnesses, all have been examined except the summoned witness.

In view of directions issued in case of co-accused namely Babbu Bharti, no ground is made out to grant any indulgence to the petitioner.

This petition is accordingly, dismissed.”

[6]. In view of direction issued by the Co-ordinate Bench on 23.06.2020 in the aforesaid case of co-accused Babbu Bharti vs. State of Punjab, the present petition is dismissed as withdrawn with a liberty to the petitioner to approach the trial

Court in case the trial is further delayed.

[7]. Dismissed as withdrawn with the aforesaid liberty.
