The instant Petition has been filed under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure seeking Anticipatory Bail on behalf of the Petitioner in case FIR No.95, dated 23<sup>rd</sup> May, 2020, registered under Sections 406, 420 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 and Section 13 of the Punjab Travel Professionals (Regulation) Act, 2014, at Police Station City Nawanshahr, District SBS Nagar.

2. Mr. Naresh Pal Chandel, Advocate has put in appearance on behalf of Respondent No.2 through Video Conferencing and sent up a copy of his Memorandum of Appearance by E-mail; Be kept on record. He further submits that the matter has been actually compromised between the parties as claimed by the Petitioner.

3. In the circumstances, considering the nature of material

available on file, and in view of the compromise arrived at between the parties, the Petitioner's prayer for Anticipatory Bail is allowed and the Petitioner shall be released on bail subject to his furnishing personal and surety bonds to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer. However, he shall join the investigation as and when called upon to do so and shall abide by the conditions as provided under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

4. Disposed off.

5. The Complainant, however, will be at liberty to seek cancellation of Bail, if the Petitioner backs out from the compromise.
