The petitioner seeks regular bail in a petition filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C. in FIR No. 28 dated 30.01.2020 under Sections 420, 465, 467, 468, 471, 120-B IPC and Section 13 of Punjab Travel Professionals Act, 2014, registered at Police Station Dinanagar, District Gurdaspur.

Counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner is in custody for the last 1 month and 18 days, as per the custody certificate dated 18.09.2020. It is submitted that though she is on interim bail due to the pandemic of Covid-19, but liable to be released on regular bail, as she has been roped in on account of the fact that her husband Vishal had interacted with the complainant and has five children to look after.

A perusal of the FIR which was lodged by complainant-Baby would go on to show that the allegations are of sending to Canada for Permanent Residency and Vishal Nangli the husband as such alongwith the

petitioner is alleged to have come to her house and had taken Rs.40,000/-
The balance amount as such of Rs.10,000/- and Rs.2,00,000/- was
transferred in the account of the husband Vishal Nangli.

Keeping in view the above, counsel has made out a case for
grant of regular bail to the petitioner, since her antecedents are clean, as
there is no other case of similar nature against her is pending.

Accordingly, the petition is allowed and the petitioner is
directed to be released on bail to the satisfaction of Duty
Magistrate/Illaqa Magistrate, Gurdaspur.
