1. Case is being taken up for hearing through Video Conferencing due to the outbreak of Covid-19 pandemic.

2. Prayer in the petition under Sections 11& 12 of the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971, is for initiating action against the respondent for willfully and deliberately violating orders (Annexure P-1) dated 07.12.2019 in CWP No.35571 of 2019 in case titled as '**Navtech Projects Private Limited** versus **State of Haryana and others.**'

3. Learned counsel contends that vide order (Annexure P-1) dated 07.12.2019, CWP No.35571 of 2019 was disposed of with a direction to Haryana State Industrial and Infrastructure Development Corporation Limited, Haryana through its Managing Director to take action on representations dated 14.09.2018, 30.01.2019, 21.06.2019 as well as 05.08.2019, in accordance with law and pass necessary orders within 03 months from the date of receipt of certified copy of the order and if required to grant opportunity of personal hearing before passing the order.

4. At the outset, learned counsel for the petitioner states that orders dated 19.11.2020 having been passed by the respondent in compliance with orders dated 07.12.2019 in CWPNo.35571 of 2019, he does not press the contempt petition and may be permitted to withdraw the same with liberty to challenge decision dated 19.11.2020, in accordance with law.

5. The same is not opposed by learned counsel for the respondent.

6. In view of the statement of learned counsel for the parties, the Contempt Petition is ***disposed of*** as not pressed with the liberty as prayed for.
