COVID-19 Pandemic.

The present petition has been filed under Section 438 Code of
Criminal Procedure for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case
FIR No.151 dated 31.5.2020 registered for the offences punishable under
Sections 15 of NDPS Act (Section 29 of NDPS Act added lateron) at
Police Station Bhawanigarh, District Sangrur.

Heard.

The bail application is contested by the learned State counsel.
Reply by way of affidavit of Gobinder Singh, Deputy Superintendent of
Police, Sub Division Bhawanigarh, District Sangrur is taken on record.

As per the allegations appearing in the FIR, the police received
secret information against Jatinder Kumar, Prince and Sukhwinder Singh to

of the said secret information, *naka* was laid and the aforesaid three persons apprehended along with 105 KG of poppy husk. Petitioner-Jora Singh was nominated as accused in this case on the basis of disclosure statement made by aforesaid Jatinder Kumar, with whom, he was having contact through mobile phone.

Learned State counsel, on the instructions of SI Santokh Singh, has submitted that the petitioner joined investigation with the police in compliance of the previous order dated 18.9.2020 passed by this Court and he cooperated with the police during the investigation and is not required by the police for any further investigation. It also appears that in this case, no contraband was recovered from the conscious possession of the petitioner. The alleged recovery has already been effected in this case. So, no purpose will be served, even if the petitioner is sent to police custody, at this stage.

Consequently, without making any comment on the merits of the case, this petition is allowed and order of interim bail dated 18.9.2020 passed by this Court is hereby made absolute. The petitioner shall abide by the conditions as envisaged under Section 438 (2) of Cr.P.C.
