Hearing of the case was held through video conferencing on account of restricted functioning of the Courts.

On 21.09.2020, the following order was passed:-

“The petitioner prays for grant of pre-arrest bail in a criminal case arising from FIR No.268, dated 30.8.2020, registered under Section 376 (2) IPC at Police Station Sector 39, Chandigarh.

As per the allegations contained in the FIR, petitioner’s husband had relations with the prosecutrix for sometime. It is alleged that the petitioner has sent some text messages to the prosecutrix and her friends, in order to threaten her.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner was trying to save her marriage. On the other hand, learned counsel appearing for the first informant has submitted that offences under Section 323, 506 and 509 IPC, have also been added in the FIR.

Keeping in view the aforesaid facts, it is considered appropriate that let the petitioner join investigation.

In the meantime, in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on interim bail subject to furnishing personal bonds and surety to the satisfaction

of Arresting/Investigating Officer. However, the petitioner shall join the investigation as and when called upon to do so and shall abide by the conditions as provided under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.”

Learned counsel appearing for the Union Territory, Chandigarh, on instructions from Inspector Mohinder Singh, has submitted that the petitioner has joined the investigation, cooperated and is not required for further custodial interrogation.

Keeping in view the aforesaid facts, the interim order dated 21.09.2020, passed by this Court, is made absolute.

Accordingly, the present petition is allowed.
