Present is the second petition filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C. for the grant of regular bail in FIR No.75 dated 14.3.2017, under Sections 302, 307, 147, 148, 149, 323, 325, 212, 109, 506 and 120-B IPC and under Sections 25/27/30 of the Arms Act registered at Police Station, Sadar Hansi, Distt. Hisar.

Mr.Bipan Ghai, learned Senior counsel assisted by Mr.Paras Talwar, Advocate, for the petitioner submits that he does not wish to press the present petition, at this stage in view of the fact that one of the co-accused in the present FIR had filed CRM-M-8581-2020 in which a Coordinate Bench of this Court had directed the trial Court to make an endeavour to complete the trial within a period of six months from the next date of hearing fixed before that Court and therefore, he wishes to withdraw the present petition, at this stage. He has further prayed for granting liberty to file fresh bail application if so required after expiry of six months.

Dismissed as withdrawn, at this stage.

As successive bail applications are maintainable under law subject to various exceptional reasons including changed circumstances and availability of fresh grounds, no liberty is required for filing bail application. The petitioner may file a fresh bail application after expiry of six months if required and in accordance with law.
