Heard through video conferencing.

The petitioner is seeking regular bail in FIR No.6, dated 17.08.2016, under Sections 148, 149 IPC and Sections 25, 27 of the Arms Act (offence under Section 307 IPC added later on), registered at Police Station State Special Operation Cell, District Amritsar.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that it is a case of no injury and it is alleged that gun shots were fired but no one was injured. He also contends that similarly situated co-accused, namely, Harmandeep Singh, Mangal Singh @ Manga and Ranjodh Singh @ Sunny Zhama were granted regular bail by the Coordinate Benches of this Court in CRM-M-42753-2016, CRM-M-1819-2017 and CRM-M-932-2018 on 06.12.2016, 27.01.2017 and 20.02.2018 respectively; and Balwinder Singh @ Doni has been granted regular bail by this Court in CRM-M-13233-2019 on 18.10.2019. He further states that the petitioner is in custody for over two years.

Learned State counsel, upon instructions from ASI Kanwaljit Singh, states that the petitioner is involved in several other cases but he is not in a position to controvert the submissions that it is a case of no injury. As per the custody certificate, the petitioner is in custody for over two years. He also states that 01 out of 25 prosecution witnesses has been examined.

Heard.

In view of the submissions of the learned counsel for the petitioner especially when it is a case of no injury, the petitioner is in custody for over two years, similarly situated co-accused have been granted bail and the conclusion of the trial is likely to take sometime, I deem it a fit case to grant the concession of regular bail to the petitioner.

Therefore, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, the instant petition is allowed. The petitioner is ordered to be released on regular bail on his furnishing requisite bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate concerned.
