1. Case is being taken up for hearing through Video Conferencing due to the outbreak of Covid-19 pandemic.

2. Prayer in the petition under Article 215 of the Constitution of India read with Sections 10 & 12 of the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971 is for taking action against the respondent for not complying with order (Annexure P-1) dated 08.11.2019, passed in CWP No.30668 of 2019 in case titled as '*Tripta Mastana versus State of Punjab and others*' to decide the claim made in legal notice dated 12.08.2019 by passing a speaking order within three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of the order.

3. Notice of motion.

4. Ms. Deepali Puri, Addl. A.G., Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of the respondent and on instructions from Mr. Sanjiv Garg, Deputy Director, Rural Development and Panchayati Raj, Punjab, Vikas Bhawan, Mohali, states that the claim made in legal notice dated 12.08.2019 would

- 5. The same satisfies learned counsel for the petitioner.

Accordingly, in the light of the statement of learned counsel for the parties, the contempt petition is disposed of as not calling for any orders except directing the respondent to pass order on the claim made in the legal notice dated 12.08.2019 within 03 weeks from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order and to convey the decision taken on the same to the petitioner within the aforementioned period of time.
- 7. However, it is made clear that in case the needful is not done within the stipulated period of time, the petitioner would be at liberty to move an application for revival of the contempt petition.
