In the present writ petition, the claim of the petitioner is for grant of benefit of work-charge service which the petitioner had rendered prior to the regularization of services as qualifying service for computing the pensionary benefits. Learned counsel for the respondent at the outset states that during the pendency of the writ petition, the claim of the petitioner has already been reconsidered and the benefit of work-charge service rendered by the petitioner from 15.11.1974 till 09.12.1976 has already been granted and even the consequential benefits have been released to the petitioner.

Learned counsel for the petitioner does not deny the said fact. Learned counsel for the petitioner states that the payments for which the petitioner was entitled for at the time of retirement i.e. on

31.01.2006, have been released in August 01, 2018 and, therefore, petitioner is entitled for the interest and liberty may be granted to the petitioner in this regard to approach the respondent by filing appropriate representation.

Learned counsel for the respondent states that in case any representation is filed by the petitioner claiming interest, the same will be considered in accordance with law and appropriate order will be passed within a period of three months of the submission of the same.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that in view of the statement of the learned counsel for the respondent, petitioner does not press this writ petition any further and the same be disposed of having been not pressed. Ordered accordingly.
