Case has been taken up through video conferencing in view of the outbreak of Pandemic COVID-19.

Ld. Counsel for respondent No.3 has sent up reply through E-mail;

It transpires that on 03.11.2020, the petitioner has been assigned duties in the O&M Branch for checking estimates, vide separate order No.1729/E9/G dated 03.11.2020, a copy of which (in vernacular) has been sent up through E-mail on behalf of the said respondent; Be kept on record.

Ld. Counsel for the petitioner, however, submits that the averment in Para No.4 of the reply to the effect that after given his Joining Report at the Despatch Counter, the petitioner never attended office, is incorrect.

Be that as it may, since the actual relief sought for in the Writ Petition for directing respondent No.1 to allow the petitioner to join his duties with respondent No.3 has by now already become available to him, no cause of action to pursue the instant Writ Petition, at this stage, survives.

Accordingly, the instant petition is disposed off as having been rendered infructuous, but with liberty to the petitioner to seek appropriate legal remedies qua his other grievances, which he might have against the respondents.
