The petitioner is seeking regular bail in FIR No.115 dated 19.07.2020, under Sections 406, 420, 467, 468, 471, 370 and 120-B IPC and Section 10 of the Immigration Act, registered at Police Station Radaur, District Yamuna Nagar.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner is not named in the FIR and she has been arraigned as an accused on the statement of co-accused that a sum of ₹1.5 lacs was transferred in her account. He further contends that the matter has been compromised. The petitioner has paid a sum of ₹1.5 lacs to the complainant. He has referred to the copy of the statement of the complainant at Annexure A-1 and copy of the demand draft at Annexure A-2. The petitioner is 29 year old lady and not involved in any other criminal case. She is in custody for almost 03 months.

Learned State counsel upon instructions from ASI Gurmej Singh states that the challan has been filed but charges are yet to be framed.

In view of the submissions of learned counsel for the petitioner, especially when the matter has been compromised, petitioner, who is 29 year old lady, is in custody for almost 03 months, she is not involved in any other criminal case, Covid 19 pandemic and the conclusion of the trial is likely to take some time, I deem it a fit case to grant the concession of regular bail to the petitioner.

Therefore, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, the petition is allowed. The petitioner is ordered to be released on regular bail on her furnishing requisite bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate concerned.
