The case has been taken up for hearing through video-conferencing.

Prayer is for grant of anticipatory bail in case bearing FIR No.126 dated 20.09.2020 registered under Sections 3, 4 and 5 of The Immoral Traffic (Prevention) Act, 1956 at Police Station Sadar, District Ludhiana.

The allegations are under Sections 3, 4 and 5 of The Immoral Traffic (Prevention) Act, 1956. The FIR was registered on the basis of secret information. The raid was conducted. Four persons (two men and two women) were arrested at the spot as they were found in objectionable position. Some

currency notes and safety measures (contraceptives) were also recovered from the rooms. Petitioner is alleged to be the kingpin as she is operating such illegal activities from her house. On seeing the police party, she fled away from the spot.

Learned counsel for the petitioner with reference to some register entry submits that in fact those four persons were arrested on 21.09.2020.

Learned State counsel on instructions from ASI Devinder Singh has produced on record photocopy of arrest memos showing that the co-accused were arrested on 20.09.2020.

In my considered opinion, custodial interrogation of the petitioner is required in order to unearth the illegal racket.

In view of aforesaid position, I do not find any justification to grant any indulgence in favour of the petitioner.

This petition is accordingly dismissed.
