1. Case is being taken up for hearing through Video Conferencing due to the outbreak of pandemic Covid-19.

2. Prayer in the Petition under Article 215 of the Constitution of India read with Sections 10 and 11 of the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971, is for initiating proceedings against the respondent for willful and deliberate disobedience of order Annexure P/1 dated 01.04.2019, passed in CWP No.8821/2019, in case titled as 'Manoj Kumar and others vs. State of Haryana and another'.

3. Learned counsel contends that vide order Annexure P/1 dated 01.04.2019, CWP No.8821/2019, was disposed of on the statement of learned Asstt. Advocate General, Haryana, that final result of the post of Shift Attendant had been declared on 08.03.2019 and individual result of the candidates would be uploaded within four weeks from 01.04.2019 and that in the circumstances, liberty was given to the petitioners therein to get the petition revived, if on ascertaining of their marks, they were found to have secured more marks than the last selected candidate. Learned counsel contends that despite the directions of the Coordinate Bench dated 01.04.2019, to upload the

individual result of the candidates within four weeks from April, 2019, result of the petitioners was not uploaded.

4. Notice to the respondent, to show cause as to why proceedings under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971 be not initiated against her for non-compliance with the orders of this Court dated 01.04.2019, in CWP No.8821/2019.

5. Ms. Kirti Singh, DAG, Haryana, accepts notice on behalf of the respondent and on instructions from the respondent states that in fact individual result of candidates for the post of Shift Attendant was uploaded on the website of the Commission on 07.11.2019 and although it was mentioned in the said notice that result of candidates would be available during the period 01.11.2019 to 29.11.2019, the same was available even as on date and would continue to remain available on the website of the Commission.

6. The same satisfies learned counsel for the petitioners.

7. Accordingly, in view of the statement of learned counsel for the parties, the Contempt Petition is disposed of as not calling for any further orders. However, it is made clear that in case of any difficulty faced by the petitioners in accessing their result on the website of the Commission, they would be at liberty to move an application for revival of the Contempt Petition.
