The petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No. 221 dated 30.06.2020, under Sections 323, 324, 34 and 452 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 ('IPC' - for short) (Section 326 IPC added later on), registered at Police Station Singh Kanina, District Mohindergarh.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that no specific injury has been attributed to the petitioner and his presence is doubtful, as it is alleged in the FIR that two other co-accused, who had entered the house of the complainant, had been caught by them and handed over to the police. It is not mentioned in the FIR that the petitioner had run away from the spot. He also contends that the FIR is a counter-blast to the FIR lodged by the mother of the petitioner on 15.04.2020 against the complainant, who is the uncle of the petitioner. The father of the petitioner has expired and there is a dispute between the parties with regard to property.

This Court, by the order dated 14.10.2020, had directed the petitioner to appear before the Investigating Officer and join the investigation and in the event of his arrest, he was ordered to be released on ad-interim bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating/Arresting Officer, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from HC Sunil, states that the petitioner has joined investigation.

In view of the submissions of learned counsel for the petitioner and the petitioner having joined investigation, the order dated 14.10.2020 granting interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute.

However, the petitioner shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. He shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so.

The petition stands disposed of.
