B.S. Walia, J. (VC)

1. Case is being taken up for hearing through Video Conferencing due to the outbreak of Covid-19 pandemic.
2. Prayer in the petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C. is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case untraced/cancellation report (complaint No.192 of 2014) arising out of FIR No.10 dated 30.01.2005, registered under Sections 193, 195, 182, 211, 217, 409, 120-B IPC and Section 20 NDPS Act, wherein the petitioner has been summoned under Section 20 NDPS Act and Sections 116 and 511 read with Section 34 IPC.
3. Learned counsel contends that vide order dated 15.10.2020, the petitioner was directed to put in appearance before the learned trial Court on 19.10.2020, which was directed to release him on interim bail and that pursuant thereto the petitioner put in appearance before the learned trial court which released him on bail on his furnishing bail bonds in the sum of

Rs.50,000/- with one surety in the like amount and that in the circumstances, order dated 19.10.2020, is liable to be made absolute.

4. Learned AAG, Punjab, confirms the petitioner having furnished bail bonds and states that custodial interrogation of the petitioner is not required.

5. In view of the statement of learned counsel for the parties, order dated 19.10.2020, is made absolute. However, the petitioner shall continue to regularly appear before the learned trial Court during the course of trial.
