This common order shall dispose of above mentioned two petitions as they arise out of the same FIR.

These petitions have been filed under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for grant of anticipatory bail to petitioners Amandeep Singh @ Amna and Hardeep Singh @ Happy in FIR No. 185 dated 03.10.2020, registered under Sections 323, 341, 325, 506, 379-B, 148 and 149 of the IPC at Police Station Sarabha Nagar, District Ludhiana.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that as per the

allegations in the FIR, registered at the instance of complainant Harpreet Singh, it is stated that when he had gone to the house of Tony along with his friend Sukhwant Singh, he saw that petitioner Hardeep Singh was consuming liquor with aforesaid Tony and the complainant himself entered into a forcible spat with the accused/petitioners, who are father and son, which later on resulted into a scuffle.

Learned counsel for the petitioners further submits that the allegation of snatching the amount is an afterthought as the parties are known to each other and there was no such occasion to snatch any amount of any document as alleged in the FIR.

Learned State counsel could not dispute the factual position but opposed the bail.

After hearing learned counsel for the parties, without commenting anything on the merits of the case, considering the aforesaid submissions of learned counsel for the parties, the present petitions are allowed and petitioners are granted concession of anticipatory bail, subject to conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

However, it will be open for the Investigating Officer to call upon the petitioners to join investigation, if required, by issuing a written notice in this regard.
