The matter has been taken up for hearing through video conferencing due to outbreak of COVID-19.

Petitioners have filed the present writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, so as to issue appropriate writ, order or direction including a writ in the nature of mandamus, directing the respondents to rectify the anomaly in their pay scales.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that for the relief claimed in the present writ petition, the petitioners have already submitted a legal notice dated 13.08.2020(Annexure P-3) and at this stage, the petitioners would be satisfied if a time bound direction is issued to the respondents, to take a final call on their legal notice(Annexure P-3). He further submits that the required action is to be taken by respondent No.2 i.e. the Principal Secretary to Govt. of Punjab, Finance Department,

Chandigarh.

Notice of motion.

At this stage, Mr. TPS Chawla, D.A.G., Punjab, has put in appearance and accepts notice on behalf of the respondents-State.

Heard.

Without commenting on the claims so projected, but considering the fact that the petitioners have served a legal notice dated 13.08.2020(Annexure P-3) to the respondents, the present writ petition is disposed of, at this stage, with a direction to respondent No.2 to take final call on the legal notice dated 13.08.2020(Annexure P-3) submitted by the petitioners within a period of six months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.
