Matter has been taken up through Video Conferencing via Webex facility in the light of the Pandemic Covid-19 situation and as per instructions.

Grievance in the instant petition is to the action of the respondent/authorities whereby the petitioner was declared unfit to be recruited as a Constable under the Central Government Police Organization.

Petition had come up for preliminary hearing before this Court on 02.11.2020 and while issuing notice of motion, this Court directed that in the meanwhile, one post of Constable in the Organization to which the petitioner would have otherwise been recruited but for him being declared to be not medically fit, be not filled. Further directions were that the respondents would get the petitioner examined from a government medical hospital as regards his fitness for purposes of recruitment.

Ms. Gurmeet Kaur Gill, learned senior panel counsel appearing on behalf of the respondents has forwarded through whatsapp a

communication dated 17.12.2020 and a perusal thereof would reveal that in compliance of the notice of motion order passed by this Court dated 02.11.2020, the petitioner was examined by a Board of Doctors at Government Medical College, Amritsar and based upon the opinion rendered, the name of the petitioner would now be included in the list of fit candidates of CH BSF, Jalandhar Review Medical Examination Centre. The communication further recites that the medical report with regard to petitioner's fitness would now be forwarded to Head Quarters CRPF (Recruitment Branch), New Delhi for taking further necessary action with consultation of the Staff Selection Commission.

In the light of such categoric stand taken on behalf of the respondent/authorities and the petitioner having now been declared fit by a Medical Board of Doctors, nothing would survive in the instant petition and the same is disposed of as having been rendered infructuous.

Respondents are directed to take further necessary and consequential steps pursuant to the petitioner having been declared fit for the post in question.
