Prayer in the instant petition filed under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India is for issuance of directions in the nature of Mandamus to the respondents to reimburse the amount of Rs.90,478/- pertaining to medical reimbursement claims incurred by the petitioner alongwith interest @18% pa.

2. After arguing for sometime, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner would be satisfied, if the petition is disposed off with a direction to the official respondent No.3 to consider and reimburse his medical claim bill (Annexure P-1) submitted by the petitioner in accordance with law.

3. Notice of motion.

4. On the asking of Court, Ms. Anu Chatrath, Addl. AG, Punjab, who is present in Court, accepts notice on behalf of respondents No.1 to 3.

5. In view of the limited prayer made by the petitioner, the petition is disposed off with a direction to the respondent No.3 District Education Officer, Amritsar to look into the medical claim submitted on 27.09.2019 (Annexure P-1), and take necessary steps in accordance with law, as

expeditiously as possible preferably within a period of one month from the date of receipt of the certified copy of this order. Needless to say, if the petitioner is found entitled as per the Government policy, then the amount of the medical claim be released to the petitioner expeditiously within a period of two months from the date of this order.

6. The present petition stands disposed of.
