Case is taken up for hearing through video conferencing.

Through the instant petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C., the petitioner seeks anticipatory bail in case FIR No. 260 dated 12.09.2020 registered under Sections 406, 420 and 506 IPC, at Police Station Kaithal Sadar, District Kaithal.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has falsely been implicated in the present case. The petitioner is a rustic villager, do not have passport and none of his relative has gone abroad. Moreover, there is delay also in lodging the present FIR.

Learned State counsel submits that the petitioner is involved in two other similar cases, out of which in one case compromise has been effected and the status of other case is yet to be confirmed.

I have heard the learned counsel for the parties.

The complainant has specifically stated that he had handed over money to the petitioner time to time and also handed over the bank statement to the prosecution agency. The petitioner was involved in two other cases. Therefore, I do not find any ground to grant him the concession of anticipatory bail.

In view of the above, the present petition is dismissed.
