Learned Deputy Advocate General, Punjab, states that the respondents would furnish the information sought for by the petitioner within two weeks from today.

The same satisfies learned counsel for the petitioner, who states that in the circumstances, he does not press the writ petition and the same may be disposed of as not calling for any further orders while granting liberty to the petitioner to revive the writ petition in case cause survives.

In view of the position as noted above, the writ petition is disposed of by directing the respondents to furnish the information sought for by the petitioner within a period of two weeks from today. However, in case cause survives, the petitioner would be at liberty to move an application for revival of the writ petition.
