This is an application for preponing the date of
hearing of the main case on the ground that there is an oral
compromise arrived at between the parties.

The matter was taken up in Daily Lok Adalat on
28.02.2020 and following order was passed:-

"The matter has been discussed.

Learned counsel for the appellants states that to settle the matter by way of compromise, his clients would be satisfied if another sum of Rs.4,70,000/- (Rupees Four Lakhs seventy thousand only) in each case more, over and above, the amount already awarded by the MACT concerned, is granted to the appellants in full and final settlement of the claim in the present appeal and in that eventuality his clients would give up their claim regarding interest on the enhanced amount from the date of filing of the petition before the MACT which is 18.09.2010 i.e. for more than 09 years and 05 months.

Learned counsel for the respondent-Insurance Company prays for time to get concurrence from the concerned authority.

To come up on 13.03.2020.

Copy of the order be supplied to the representatives/counsel of the respondent-Insurance Company.”

The present application has been filed by respondent No.3- Insurance Company accepting the proposal of compromise. Respondent No.3 is ready and willing to compromise the issue at an amount of Rs.4,70,000/- over and the above the amount awarded by the Tribunal. This enhancement is towards full and final settlement of the claim of the appellants including interest component as on date. The enhanced compensation to the tune of Rs.4,70,000/- shall be paid to the appellants through appellant No.1 by demand draft within a period of three weeks with an intimation to learned counsel for the appellants.

Learned counsel for the appellants has agreed to the

aforesaid course.

In view of settlement arrived at between the parties,
the date of hearing is preponed and the main case is taken up
today.

Main case

Disposed of, in terms of compromise.

Both the parties shall abide by the terms and
conditions of the compromise.
