Learned counsel for the petitioner very fairly admits that as per the reply filed on behalf of the respondents, all the benefits have already been released to the petitioner, but he pleads ignorance as to whether, factually the same have been released to the petitioner or not. Learned counsel for the petitioner states that the petitioner has not contacted him and therefore, he is not in a position to admit as to whether, the actual benefits have been released to the petitioner or not.

Learned counsel for the respondents states that once an affidavit has been filed wherein, it has been stated that all the benefits have been released to the petitioner, it cannot be imagined that the said affidavit has not been implemented so far.

Keeping in view the above, the present writ petition is disposed of, with the liberty to the petitioner to approach the respondents, in case, any of the relief, which is stated to be released by the respondents in their reply, has not actually been received by the petitioner by making appropriate

representation. The respondents are directed that in case, any representation is filed by the petitioner, an appropriate order be passed on the same within a period of three months from the receipt of the said representation.
