All cases listed today have been taken up for hearing by way of video conferencing because of the situation existing due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

By this petition, the petitioner seeks issuance of a writ in the nature of '*mandamus*' directing respondents no. 2 and 3 to protect her life and liberty at the hands of respondents no. 4 to 11 and further, to initiate legal proceedings against the said respondents on the basis of the representation made by her on 08.11.2020 (a copy of which has been annexed as Annexure P-2 with the petition), before the Commissioner of Police, Ludhiana (respondent no. 2).

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that other than the petitioners' husband and his family, even the petitioners' own parents (respondents no. 10 and 11) are not supporting her and therefore she has been forced to take shelter with someone known to her (a lady), but she is under threat from respondents no. 4 to 11.

He submits that at this stage, the petitioner would be satisfied if a direction is issued to the Commissioner of Police, Ludhiana, to take action on her representation, as per law.

Consequently, without making any comment on the actual merits of the case, this petition is disposed of with a direction to the Commissioner of Police, Ludhiana, to direct a Deputy Commissioner of Police (SP), to go into the grievance of the petitioner after hearing her and all others concerned, and thereafter to take action as is warranted as per law, within a period of three weeks from today.
