By way of filing this Criminal Writ Petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents No.2 and 3 to protect the life and liberty of the petitioner and his family and to restrain the private respondent No.4 and his family not to harass or interfere in the peaceful life of the petitioner.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that some unknown person had threatned him on 23.09.2020 and the representation in this regard has already been given by him to the Station House Officer, Police Station Khanna, but no action has been taken upon the same so far. He has pointed out that on his complaint a case FIR No 194, dated 06.12.2019 (Annexure P-1) has already been registered against respondent No.4 and after his release

on bail, he is extending threats to the petitioner. He prays that the necessary protection be granted to him by issuing directions to the official respondents.

During the course of hearing, it is not disputed by the learned counsel that the investigation in FIR No 194, dated 06.12.2019 (Annexure P-1) is complete and the final report stands filed. Apart from this, it is also not disputed by him that no complaint has ever been made by the petitioner against respondent No.4-accused for extending threats to the petitioner or for pressurising him to withdraw the criminal case. Even otherwise, the representation does not contain any particulars, therefore, no ground is made out for invoking the extraordinary writ jurisdiction.

Dismissed.
