G.S.SANDHAWALIA, J. (Oral)

The petitioners, in a petition filed under Articles 226 and 227 of the Constitution of India, seek quashing of the public notice dated 27.10.2020 (Annexure P-4) for the written examination for appointment of ETT teachers which is fixed for 29.11.2020 in pursuance of the advertisement dated 06.03.2020. The ground taken is that the Punjab and Haryana borders are sealed by the State Governments to prevent the protesters from entering the cities amid Covid-19 as the farmers protest *Delhi Chalo* against the Centre's new farm laws.

The test which is stated to be fixed for 29.11.2020, as per the admit cards, the petitioners have to give the same at Gian Jyoti Global School, Phase-II, Mohali, SAS Nagar. The petitioners are residents of District Sirsa, which is on the other end and at least 250 kilometers from the borders of Delhi. The route which they have to take is nowhere close to the route which the farmers are taking to go towards Delhi.

The writ petition, thus, is misconceived and only an attempt to stall the legal and valid examination process in which thousands of candidates will be appearing.

In such circumstances, this Court is of the opinion that no case is made out to stall the examination as the place of examination of the petitioners and the borders of Delhi are 250 kilometers apart.

Accordingly, finding no merit in the present writ petition, the same is dismissed in limine.
