The petitioner has filed present petition under Section 439 Cr.P.C. seeking regular bail in FIR No.166 dated 01.08.2020 under Sections 452, 323, 148, 149 and 506 IPC (Section 326 IPC was added later on) registered at Police Station Dasuya, District Hoshiarpur.

Learned counsel for the petitioner relies upon the order dated 04.11.2020 passed by this Court in ***CRM-M-33826 of 2020*** titled as ***Shamsher Singh Versus State of Punjab***, whereby co-accused Shamsher Singh has been granted regular bail. He submits that the petitioner is similarly placed in the case and he is in custody since 05.09.2020.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Sarvjeet Singh, does not dispute the fact that the case of petitioner is similar to that of co-accused Shamsher Singh.

Considering the fact that the petitioner is in custody since 05.09.2020 and his case is similar to that of co-accused Shamsheer Singh, who has already been granted regular bail by this Court on 04.11.2020, this Court finds that no useful purpose would be served by detaining the petitioner in further custody.

Accordingly, the present petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on his furnishing adequate bail bonds and surety bonds to the satisfaction of learned trial Court.

The observations made hereinabove shall not be construed as an expression of opinion on the merits of the case and the trial Court shall decide the case without being influenced with these observations in any manner.
