The petitioners are seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No. 278 dated 25.09.2020, under Sections 148, 149, 323 and 506 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860, registered at Police Station Pinjore, District Panchkula.

Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that it is a case of version and cross-version in which uncle of petitioners No. 2 and 3, namely, Hans Raj had suffered a fracture. He also contends that the injuries which are attributed to the petitioners are simple in nature. He further contends that co-accused, namely, Hans Raj and Tarsem have been granted anticipatory bail by this Court by order dated 25.11.2020 passed in CRM-M No. 34225 of 2020.

Issue notice to the respondent.

At the asking of the Court, Mr. Vikrant Pamboo, DAG, Haryana, accepts notice on behalf of the respondent-State.

Mr. Sanjiv Gupta, Advocate, has put in appearance on behalf of the complainant. He contends that in view of the seriousness of the allegations against the petitioners, they are not entitled to the concession of anticipatory bail. He also contends that there was an injunction in favour of the complainant party and the petitioners had tried to take possession of the land forcibly. He, however, is not in a position to dispute that only simple injuries are attributed to the petitioners.

Without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case and in view of the submissions of learned counsel for the petitioners, I deem it a fit case to grant the concession of anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

Therefore, the petitioners are directed to appear before the investigating officer within a period of 15 days from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order and on their doing so, they shall be released on bail to the satisfaction of the arresting/investigating officer till submission of report under Section 173 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 ('Cr.P.C.' - for short). The petitioners shall continue to join investigation and shall furnish undertaking that they shall abide by the conditions as envisaged under Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C. Thereafter, they will be permitted to furnish regular bail bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court.

The petition stands disposed of in the aforementioned terms.
