Learned counsel for the petitioner very fairly states that in the present writ petition, release of the retiral benefits is claimed, which benefits have been released as the averments, which have been made in para 5 of the reply. Learned counsel for the petitioner further states that as he has not been able to contact his client, petitioner be given liberty to approach the respondents by filing appropriate representation, in case the petitioner feels any of his benefit is yet to be released by the respondents.

Learned counsel for the respondents very fairly states that in case any representation is filed by the petitioner claiming any relief, the same will be disposed of by passing an appropriate speaking order within a period of three months from the date of receipt of such representation.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that keeping in view

the undertaking given by learned counsel for the respondents, he does not press this writ petition any further and prays that the same may be disposed of having been not pressed.
