Cases have been taken up for hearing through
Video Conferencing.

This order shall dispose of the above noted five
petitions as common questions of law and facts are involved
therein.

All these petitions have been filed under Article
226 of the Constitution for issuance of a writ in the nature
of mandamus directing the respondents to revise the State
Health Mission, Haryana Contractual Employees Service
Bye-Laws, 2018, and to revise and step-up the pay scales of
the petitioners in the same manner as enhanced to
contractual employees in the junior cadre.

At the outset, learned State counsel points out
that with regard to the revision and upgradation of the pay-
scales, the matter has been forwarded to the Pay Anomaly
Committee, constituted by respondent No.3 vide letter dated
25.10.2018. He further submits that the said Committee
has already submitted its final report to the Finance
Department for further necessary approvals.

As pointed out by the learned State counsel, which is not disputed by the learned counsel for the petitioners, the grievance raised by the petitioners in the present writ petitions, is pending approval before the Finance Department based on the report by the Pay Anomaly Committee.

In view of the above, all the petitions are disposed of with a direction to the Finance Department to take a decision on the report submitted by the Pay Anomaly Committee within a period of three months from the date of receipt of the certified copy of this order.

Needless to say, if still aggrieved, it would be open to the petitioners to approach this Court.
