The instant Petition has been filed under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure seeking Regular Bail in Crime No.3/2019 dated 10.01.2019, registered under Sections 8/20/29 & 60 of the NDPS Act, 1985 at Police Station N.C.B., Chandigarh.

2. Huge Contraband in the form of Charas, was allegedly recovered from the Petitioner as well as Yusuf Ali from two vehicles, is otherwise well above the commercial quantity.

3. It is submitted by Ld. Counsel for the Respondent-NCB that several of the prosecution witnesses have already been examined and the matter is now fixed on 4th of March this year for the examination of the remaining witnesses.

- 4. In such circumstances, this is not a fit case for releasing the Petitioner on bail, at this stage.
