Prayer in this application is for withdrawal of the main case i.e. CRM-M-39582-2019.

Allowed as prayed for and the main case, which is fixed for 11.11.2020, is taken up today for hearing.

CRM-M-39582-2019

Prayer in this 2nd application is for grant of regular bail to the petitioner in FIR No.52 dated 25.05.2015 registered under Section 21 of the NDPS Act, at Police Station Satnampura, District Kapurthala.

The earlier one was dismissed as withdrawn on 28.07.2017.

As per the allegations in the FIR, 100 gms. of Diphenoxylate powder was recovered from the petitioner. Thereafter, the petitioner was granted the concession of interim bail on 02.07.2015

CASE HEARD THROUGH VIDEO CONFERENCING

awaiting the report of FSL and on receiving of the same, the interim bail granted to the petitioner was dismissed on 11.04.2017, however, the petitioner did not surrender before the Court. Later on, the petitioner was declared proclaimed offender on 15.03.2018 and he was re-arrested on 06.04.2019.

Counsel for the State has filed the Custody Certificate and as per the Custody Certificate, the petitioner is involved in one more FIR No.29 dated 26.03.2019 under the NDPS Act and one FIR under Section 62-A of the Prisons Act.

Considering the fact that the petitioner, at one point of time, was declared a proclaimed offender and did not surrender for a considerable long time and is also involved in one more FIR under the NDPS Act, no ground for grant of bail is made out.

Dismissed.
