This application is ordered and the date of hearing of the main petition is advanced to today.

CRM-M-43500-2019

The petitioner is one amongst the accused in FIR No. 109 dated 24.10.2018 on the file of Police Station Mehna, District Moga, registered under Sections 382 IPC (deleted later on) and Sections 392, 473, 411 and 120-B IPC and Sections 25 and 54 of the Arms Act, 1959. By way of this petition, he seeks regular bail under Section 439 Cr.P.C.

Mr. Ajay Pal Singh Gill, learned Deputy Advocate General, Punjab, would oppose the bail petition on the ground that the petitioner is involved in four other cases.

However, the record reflects that two of the co-accused of the petitioner have already been granted regular bail though both of them were also involved in five other cases of a similar nature. Therefore, being identically situated, the petitioner would be entitled to be treated on par with the other co-accused.

The petition is accordingly allowed directing release of the petitioner on his furnishing a personal bond for a sum of Rs. 20,000/- along with two sureties for a like sum each to the satisfaction of the Duty Magistrate/Illaqa Magistrate. The petitioner shall not offer any inducement, threat or promise to any person concerned with the case.
