This petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. by the petitioner for issuance of directions to respondent Nos.2 to 4 to take remedial action on the complaint No.2305-PD dated 26.08.2019 submitted through the attorney of the petitioner, namely, Paramjit Singh and register FIR in view of the allegations contained therein.

On 22.10.2019, learned State counsel was directed to find out the status of the inquiry on the representation (Annexure P-4). In response to the said order, status report by way of affidavit of Gurpreet Singh, PPS, Deputy Superintendent of Police, Crime Against Property, Hoshiarpur on behalf of respondent Nos.1 to 4 has been filed. As per this reply, it is mentioned that the petitioner is having landed property in Village Badla and the said property was being looked after by his attorney Paramjit Singh.

Respondent No.6 is owner of the property, situated in Village Sihna, and

she obtained a loan of ₹ 29,00,000/- by mortgaging her property and the said loan has not been obtained on the landed property of the petitioner and he has no liability upon the loan amount. Besides this, petitioner has also filed a criminal complaint bearing No.CRM-71 of 2019 against the private respondents for the same allegations, which is pending in the Court of Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Hoshiarpur.

In view of the reply filed by the State, particularly in Para 3, learned counsel for the petitioner does not press this petition.

Dismissed as not pressed.
