Custody certificate of petitioner has been filed. Same is taken on record. Be tagged at appropriate place.

Through instant second petition under Section 439 Cr.P.C. prayer has been made for grant of regular bail to the petitioner in a case arising from FIR No.86 dated 05.08.2019, registered under Sections 336, 506, 307, 427, 34 IPC and 25 & 27 of the Arms Act, at Police Station Sadar Ahmedgarh, District Sangrur.

According to prosecution, in the intervening night of 5/6.08.2019, the petitioner, while fleeing away from the spot, fired shots in the air from his .12 bore rifle, hitting the glass and bonnet of the car of complainant.

Heard.

As per custody certificate, petitioner is in custody since 06 months 08 days. Out of three other FIRs registered against him, two have been quashed on the basis of compromise and in one case, he has been acquitted. Thus, as on date, there is no criminal case

against the petitioner except the present one. The fire shot, allegedly fired by the petitioner, did not hit anyone. Conclusion of trial may take a sufficient long time. No useful purpose would be served by detaining the petitioner any more in jail.

Considering overall facts and circumstances, but without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, the petition is allowed. Consequently, petitioner Amritpal Singh is ordered to be released on bail during pendency of trial, if not required in any other case, on his furnishing bail bonds and surety bonds to the satisfaction of Trial Court/Duty Magistrate concerned.
