SUDIP AHLUWALIA, J. (Oral)

In this petition, the petitioner, who is the accused person in FIR No.154, dated 29.07.2018, registered under Sections 279 & 337 of the Indian Penal Code (Section 338 of the IPC added later on), at Police Station Sector-14, Panchkula, District Panchkula, (Annexure P-1), has prayed for quashing of FIR, along with all subsequent proceedings, on the basis of compromise dated 18.10.2019 (Annexure P-2) arrived at between the parties.

2. With the intervention of respectables and elderly people of the society, the complainant (respondent No.2) and his wife, the injured (respondent No.5) have arrived at a settlement with the accused vide Compromise Deed (Annexure P-2), which is duly signed by him. The matter

was referred to the Court below for recording of statements of the parties and to report with respect to genuineness of the compromise arrived at between the parties.

3. The Chief Judicial Magistrate, Panchkula vide report dated 07.12.2019, has apprised this Court that the compromise arrived at between the parties is without any kind of undue influence or pressure.

4. Respondents No.2 and 3 are represented by their Counsel and do not oppose the compromise.

5. In view of the report of the Chief Judicial Magistrate, Panchkula, and in view of the decisions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in "***Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and another***", 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and "***Narinder Singh and Others Vs. State of Punjab and Another***", (2014) 6 SCC 466, this Court is of the opinion that no useful purpose can be served by keeping with the criminal proceedings pending, since the complainants have themselves compromised the dispute with the petitioner/accused person.

6. In the circumstances, the present petition is allowed. FIR No.154, dated 29.07.2018, registered under Sections 279 & 337 of the Indian Penal Code (Section 338 of the IPC added later on), at Police Station Sector-14, Panchkula, District Panchkula (Annexure P-1), along with all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom, is hereby quashed *qua* the petitioner.
