By this application, advancement of the date of hearing in the accompanying petition is sought by the applicant/petitioner, on the ground that matter has been compromised between the parties and a report pursuant to the order of this court dated 02.11.2019, has also been received.

Notice in the application, with Mr.P.S.Thind, DAG, Punjab, accepting notice at the asking of the court on behalf of respondent State and Mr. R.S.Dhaliwal, Advocate, accepting notice on behalf of respondent no.2/complainant. They do not oppose the allowing of this application.

Consequently, this application is allowed with the date of hearing in the accompanying petition advanced to today itself with the consent of the parties.

By this petition, the petitioner seeks quashing, on the basis of a compromise (Annexure P-2), arrived at between the petitioners and respondent

no.2, of FIR No.0009, dated 23.01.2018, registered at Police Station Dasuya, District Hoshiarpur, alleging therein the commission of the offences punishable under Sections 354-A and 506 of the IPC (with Sections 294 and 509 IPC added later), as also all other subsequent proceedings arising therefrom.

Pursuant to the order of this Court dated 02.11.2019, the report of the learned Sub Divisional Magistrate, Dasuyya, dated 06.01.2020, is on record, stating to the effect that the petitioner and the complainant in the FIR, i.e. respondent no.2, have compromised the matter with each other and as per the assessment of the learned Magistrate, the compromise seems to have been arrived at between the parties voluntarily, without any undue influence, pressure or coercion.

That being so, looking at the nature of the offences alleged to have been committed by the petitioner, and the fact that the matter has been compromised between the petitioner and the complainant, the present petition is allowed and FIR No.0009, dated 23.01.2018, registered at Police Station Dasuya, District Hoshiarpur, for the alleged commission of offences punishable under Sections 354-A and 506 of the IPC (with Sections 294 and 509 IPC added later), along with all proceedings emanating therefrom, is hereby quashed.
