**HARNARESH SINGH GILL, J. (Oral)**

Through the instant petition, the petitioner seeks anticipatory bail in FIR No.03 dated 04.01.2018, registered at Police Station Phase-I, SAS Nagar, Mohali, under Sections 406, 420 and 120-B IPC and Section 24 of the Immigration Act, 1983.

On 08.11.2019, a Coordinate Bench passed the following order:

*“Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner has already paid part of the payment due towards complainant and a sum of Rs.5,45,000/- is outstanding, as per him, which the petitioner will pay to the complainant in instalments and also settle the dispute regarding the total outstanding which the claimant is claiming to be around Rs.6,70,000/-.*

*Notice of motion for 27.02.2020.*

*As agreed by learned counsel for petitioner, petitioner will pay, through demand draft, Rs.1,00,000/- to the complainant or by deposit in account of complainant a sum of Rs.1,00,000/- within a period of 15 days from today. In the event of above payment/deposit in the account of complainant within 15 days, petitioner will surrender before the police and join investigation within ten days thereafter. In the event of his arrest being required, he shall be released on interim bail till the next date, subject to his furnishing bonds to the satisfaction of Arresting Officer. However, he shall abide by the terms and conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2)(i) to (iv) Cr.P.C. failing which he shall lose the benefit of interim bail allowed to him.*

*This interim bail is also subject to the condition that petitioner will pay Rs.1,00,000/- within one month of payment of Rs.1,00,000/- within 15 days from today. Non-payment of the amount on due date will result in dismissal of this petition and the petitioner may be arrested forthwith.”*

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that pursuant to the order dated 08.11.2019, the petitioner has deposited an amount of Rs.1 lakh in the account of complainant and also joined the investigation. He also undertakes that the remaining amount will also be paid to the complainant in installments in pursuance of the order dated 08.11.2019.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from HC Sanjeev Kumar, submits that the petitioner has joined the investigation and is not required for any further investigation.

Looking to the circumstances, but without commenting on the merits of the case, the present petition is allowed and the order dated

to the conditions laid down in Section 438 (2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, and further subject to the condition that the petitioner will make the payment of remaining amount to the complainant in installments in pursuance of the order dated 08.11.2019.
