Prayer in the present petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C. is for quashing of impugned order dated 20.09.2019 (Annexure P-1) passed by learned Special Judge, Amritsar in case FIR No. 133 dated 31.10.2017 registered under Section 21 of Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985, at Police Station Islamabad, Police Commissionerate, Amritsar, vide which the bail granted to the petitioner has been cancelled, bail bonds furnished by the petitioner has been forfeited and warrants of arrest was issued in case No. NDPS-984-2018 titled as 'State Vs. Chandan Gosai @ Chandan.

Vide order dated 07.11.2019, the petitioner was directed to surrender before the trial Court and the trial Court was directed to release the petitioner on interim bail subject to furnishing bail/surety bonds to its satisfaction.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has drawn the attention of this Court towards the zimni orders dated 18.11.2019 vide which the petitioner-accused along with his counsel has appeared and 3 prosecution witnesses were ordered to be summoned for 04.02.2020 and on the adjourned date, the petitioner-accused along with his counsel was present in the Court. The case is now fixed for 17.03.2020 for entire evidence of prosecution.

Learned State counsel does not dispute the aforesaid facts.

The orders dated 18.11.2019 and 04.02.2020 shows that the petitioner is appearing before the Court below.

In view of the above, order dated 07.11.2019 granting interim relief to the petitioner is made absolute, subject to the condition that if the petitioner absents himself from the Court proceedings in future without any valid reason, his application for bail shall not be entertained.

Disposed of accordingly.
