The petitioner has filed present petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C. seeking anticipatory bail in the event of his arrest in FIR No.92 dated 05.10.2019 under Sections 406 and 498-A IPC registered at Police Station Women Cell, Jalandhar, District Jalandhar.

Vide order dated 08.11.2019 passed by this Court, while staying the arrest of the petitioner, the matter was referred to the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court, where the petitioner and respondent No.2 were directed to appear on 29.11.2019.

A very vague report dated 06.01.2020 has been received from the Mediator.

At this stage, learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the matter has been compromised between the parties and a compromise deed dated 16.12.2019 has been reduced into writing which is signed by both the parties. Pursuant to the compromise deed, a petition under Section 13-B of

the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 for dissolution of marriage by way of mutual consent has been filed. In the said compromise, it has been specifically pleaded that the petitioner shall file a petition under Section 482 Cr.PC seeking quashing of the aforementioned FIR and the respondent No.2 Veena shall make the necessary statement before the Court as and when required so as to get the FIR quashed along with all consequential proceedings on the basis of compromise. The copy of compromise deed is taken on record.

In view of the compromise entered between the parties, the present petition is allowed and the order dated 08.11.2019 whereby arrest of the petitioner was stayed by this Court, is made absolute.

However, in case the petitioner is required in the case in any manner, a clear 15 days notice shall be served upon him.
