The petitioner has filed present petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C. seeking anticipatory bail in the event of her arrest in FIR No.401 dated 12.04.2019 under Sections 302, 304-B and 120-B read with Section 34 IPC registered at Police Station Sadar, District Karnal.

On November 20, 2019, while issuing notice of motion in the case, this Court had passed the following order:

“Learned counsel for the petitioner states that the petitioner is unmarried sister-in-law of the deceased and Chartered Accountant by profession. At the relevant time when the deceased had committed suicide by hanging, she was staying as a paying guest at Karnal. What has weighed to the mind of the learned Additional Sessions Judge to decline the bail is that the petitioner was admitted on interim bail and was required to join investigation, but in fact there was no such interim. Therefore, there was no question to evade investigation.

Notice of motion for 16.01.2020.

Till next date of hearing, arrest of the petitioner shall remain stayed.”

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Raj Kumar, states that during the course of investigation, the petitioner has been found innocent and in this manner, she is not required in the case.

In view of the above statement, the present petition is allowed and the order dated November 20, 2019 whereby arrest of the petitioner was stayed by this Court, is made absolute.

However, in case the petitioner is required in the case in any manner, a clear 15 days notice shall be served upon her.
