HARNARESH SINGH GILL, J. (Oral)

Through the instant petition, the petitioner seeks anticipatory bail in FIR No.49 dated 07.09.2019, registered at Police Station Tallewal, District Barnala, under Sections 323, 294, 336, 148 and 149 IPC and Sections 25, 27 and 30 of the Arms Act, 1959.

On 27.11.2019, this Court passed the following order:

“Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that in the present case enquiry was conducted and the eye witnesses have deposed in favour of the petitioner. Thus, the offence under Section 3 (1) (10) of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989 was deleted. He further submits that a cross case has been got registered by Jagdeep Singh son of Bahadar Singh, who is the cousin of the petitioner, against the complainant vide D.D.R. No. 030 dated 9.9.2019 under Sections 323, 341, 427, 34 IPC.

Meanwhile, petitioner is directed to join the investigation and if he is sought to be arrested, he shall be released on interim bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating Officer/Arresting Officer subject to the conditions as envisaged in Section 438 (2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure.”

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that pursuant to the order dated 27.11.2019 passed by this Court, the petitioner has joined the investigation.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Kamaljit Singh, submits that the petitioner has joined the investigation and is not required for any further investigation.

Looking to the circumstances, but without commenting on the merits of the case, the present petition is allowed and the order dated 27.11.2019 granting interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute, subject to the conditions laid down in Section 438 (2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure.
