The petitioner is seeking regular bail in FIR No.314 dated 14.09.2019 under Sections 379A, 420, 34 IPC, registered at Police Station DLF-II, Gurugram.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner is not named in the FIR wherein it is alleged that unknown persons had snatched the motorcycle and mobile phone of the complainant. He further contends that the motorcycle is allegedly recovered from the petitioner. He also contends that the petitioner is 22 years of age and is not involved in any other case. The petitioner is in custody for over seven months since his arrest on 10.10.2019.

Learned State counsel contends that during the course of investigation, it is transpired that the petitioner had withdrawn ₹78,000/- from the account of the complainant by assessing his mobile phone. He also contends that challan has been filed but charges are yet to be framed.

Heard through video-conferencing.

In view of the submissions of learned counsel for the petitioner especially when the petitioner is 22 years of age; he is in custody for over 07 months; he is not involved in any other case and the conclusion of the trial is likely to take some time, I deem it a fit case to grant the concession of regular bail to the petitioner.

Therefore, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, the instant petition is allowed. The petitioner is ordered to be released on regular bail on his furnishing requisite bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate concerned.
