The instant petition has been filed to challenge the order dated 15.11.2019, passed in an execution petition filed under Section 125(3) Cr.P.C..

Learned counsel for the petitioner seeks permission to withdraw the instant petition and contends that in terms of the order dated 29.11.2019, the petitioner has deposited a sum of ₹ 45000/- with the High Court, however, during the pendency of the proceedings, matter has been compromised inter se the parties and in fact a petition under Section 13-B of the Hindu Marriage Act has already been filed and the statements of the parties regarding the compromise has also been recorded on first motion stage on 18.12.2019, pursuant to which the matter is now listed there on 15.07.2020 for statement of the parties on second motion. Learned counsel also contends that it has been agreed between the parties that the amount of ₹16 lacs would be paid as full and final settlement between the parties and an amount of ₹45000/- which has been deposited in the High Court in this petition may be withdrawn through

the counsel of the petitioner as the amount of ₹16 lacs payable is inclusive of the amount of ₹45000/- deposited in the Court. Learned counsel has also placed on record the attested copy of the petition of divorce by mutual consent as well as the statements recorded in the first motion. The same are taken on record.

In view of the submission made by learned counsel for the petitioner, the petition is dismissed as withdrawn with a direction to the Registry to refund the amount of ₹45000/- lying with it to the petitioner through his counsel.
