Petitioner seeks grant of anticipatory bail under
Section 438 Cr.P.C. in case bearing FIR No. 60 dated
26.10.2019 under Sections 406/420 IPC and under Section 66 IT
Act, 2000, further Section 7 of the The Drugs and Magic
Remedies (Objectionable Advertisements) Act, 1954 and Section
4 of the Chit Funds Act 1982 have been added later on,

registered at Police Station Singh Bhagwant Pur, Rupnagar.

In the very nature of allegations that on the website theroyalventures.com, which is being run through HRBL Earth International Private Limited at its registered address Office No.98, Ward No. 14, Mata Rani Mohalla, Khanna City, Learned counsel for the petitioner refers to a certification done by Vikas Mehta President Municipal Council, Khanna to the effect that the father of the petitioner Gurdeep Singh and his sons namely Mandeep Singh and Gagandeep Singh are bona fide residents of House No. 98 Ward No.20 Mohalla Mata Rani Khanna since long being their ancestral property. Due to re-demarcation of wards, the House No. 98, Ward No. 14, Mohalla Mata Rani has been updated as Ward No. 20 and Ward No. 21.

Learned State counsel on instructions from SI Satnam Singh states that though in pursuance of order dated 07.12.2019 petitioner has joined the investigation but due to the absence of investigating officer, requirement of further joining the investigation by the petitioner cannot be spelt out with regard to applicability of offence under Section 7 of the The Drugs and

Section 4 of the Chit Funds Act 1982.

Since the petitioner has joined the investigation, therefore, it would be expedient to direct the petitioner to keep on joining the investigation as and when required to do by the investigating officer.

In view of above, order dated 07.12.2019 is made absolute, however, petitioner shall abide by the conditions as envisaged under Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C.

Petition stands disposed of.
